Join our Film Production Summer School at the Lincoln School of Film & Media, where you will have access to state-of-the-art equipment and get expert, professional tutition in development, producing, directing, cinematography, sound and post-production.

- A production credit on at least one short film, using high-end camera and post-production equipment

- A film screening at the Kinema in the Woods, a small independent cinema in a village on the outskirts of Lincoln that has been open for almost 100 years
- Tours of Lincoln's galleries, museums, the castle and the cathedral
- A welcome event at the University
- A screening of films and presentation of certificates followed by a farewell gala dinner
- A showreel DVD of Summer School work for you to take away

The Summer School will suit: Students who are about to take undergraduate or post graduate courses in film or media production at university, professionals who want to add film making to their skills, and anyone who wants to learn how to make a film.

No prior experience necessary.

The Summer School tutors include award-winning and highly acclaimed academics and practising professionals with backgrounds in major independent film and television companies. Their knowledge and passion for their subject will inspire you.

Fees

- £1,495 with accommodation or £995 without accommodation
- Fees for all students include course materials, use of state-of-the-art filming equipment and facilities, field trips, a welcome event, an end of school gala buffet and lunch from Monday to Friday.
- You must be 18 or over on the day the Summer School starts and all fees need to be paid in full before the Summer School starts in July 2016.
- Fees do not include flights or visas. Please allow plenty of time to apply for your visa. We can provide invitations if required for this process.

Accommodation

Our Student Village is situated on campus. You will be minutes away from the University's academic buildings, Student Sports Centre and the Engine Shed. The city centre is just a short walk away. The accommodation includes a single en-suite room with internet access by university WiFi. There is also a shared self-catering kitchen with crockery, cutlery, utensils, fridge, freezer, cooker and microwave. However, breakfast and lunch will be provided from Monday to Friday for all residential students.
