WHAT WOULD BE YOUR COMMITMENT?

We understand that you are busy people and so the time commitment is approached with a great deal of flexibility, and commitments can be negotiated between you and your mentee. However, we would envisage a commitment of no less than 6 meetings of between 1-2 hours over the academic year.

There will also be flexibility with the nature of your contact. Ideally contact should be face-to-face, but recognise that this may not be possible due to workload and other factors. So feel free to choose the preferred method of contact e.g. email, telephone, video chat (Skype or Facetime) and other online media.

WHAT IS OUR COMMITMENT?

We would provide suitable training and induction activities for all mentors and mentees to ensure all parties maximise the potential of the scheme. We will also co-ordinate the pairing process and aim to ensure that students are suitably committed to our mentoring initiative.

YOUR ROLE AS A MENTOR

As a mentor you will use your skills, experiences and knowledge to support students as they make the all-important decisions about their future and make the transition from university to the world of work.

You will be there to offer them advice and guidance from the perspective of either an employer or being in the job market and/or someone who has 'been there & done it'.
