SEDA Accreditation of courses

In July the ExPERT Academy team were visited by the two accreditors from SEDA for our Mentoring and Coaching course and Supervising Postgraduate Research. It is intended that both these courses will be validated as part of our new MA, allowing staff who have completed them to APL 10 L7 credits for each programme.

The accreditation event was challenging but also very stimulating. The accreditors were highly impressed by the 'joined up approach' to CPD that UWL is now implementing.

They praised the quality of the mentoring course, having talked to some of the current participants and agreed that should the accreditation be successful, it will be backdated to include the current cohort.

We did receive some conditions but were able to fulfil them ahead of schedule and recent correspondence suggests that our provisional accreditation will be approved at the board meeting in October. This process is standard practice for SEDA. Continued accreditation is contingent upon a satisfactory end of year one report.

Online PgCert

September sees a very busy time for the ExPERT Academy. Not only do we continue the mentoring and coaching course but we are launching our new online PgCert. We already have 16 candidates signed up and are receiving enquiries daily. This course is open to national or international academic staff who have at least 60 hours teaching per year. (UWL staff can access this course for free).

The PgCert/MA/PhD in Higher Education Research and Practice will be delivered wholly on line to encourage collaboration not only between institutions in the UK, but also between our partners and others abroad. For those of you teaching at UWL, you will also get the chance to attend face to face sessions to help you progress.

Academic Development and Mentoring Programme (ADAM)

We are about to invite our first cohort of academic staff to take part in the ADAM programme. Designed to offer all academic staff the opportunity to take a look at their practice and with the support of a trained mentor try to identify areas where they already demonstrate outstanding practice and to see where they might be in need of some development.

Everything changes so rapidly today and as a disciplinary expert, you cannot be expected to keep up with all the other advances that impact professional academic practice. We all have plenty to learn, however experienced we are and ADAM is designed to help you become the best you can be, ensuring our students success as well as your own. You will be assigned a mentor who will guide you through your own journey of exploration and development in safe and non-judgemental way. All academic staff will go through this process once every three years but if you want evidence for promotion or your metrics are not great and you want help to improve them, then you can request inclusion in the annual list.
