Robert Burns

25th January 1759 – 21st July 1796

Robert Burns is one of Scotland's most famous and celebrated poets. To this day we still celebrate Rabbie Burns' birthday on the 25th January. Burns night is traditionally when we eat "Haggis, Tatties, Neeps"

This is also known as "Burns supper". As the Haggis is brought to the table some of Robert's poems "Address to a Haggis" and "Great Chieftain o' the Puddin' Race" are told.



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
