

Q4. When you need help with your learning. What support do you receive from teachers and learning assistants?

100% of responses indicated that children received support from teachers and learning assistants with 66% receiving a variety of video, voice and text messages.

Q5. Do you have a daily register or check-in with your teacher?

94% of responses indicated that children are receiving check-in on a daily basis.

Q6. We are providing home learning on the following subjects: - Reading - Writing. This includes Grammar and VCOP - Spelling - Numeracy - Maths - Topic (IDL). This may include Science, Art, Music, Technology and Social Studies. - Health and Wellbeing. This includes PE and RE. Select the answer that is most true for you:

97% of responses indicated that children we being provided with all (82%) or most (15%) of the learning experiences listed. A further 3% indicated they were receiving some of these experiences.

Q7. The amount of work you have to do is:

75% of responses indicated that the amount of work given was 'about right'. 22% indicated it was 'too much', and 3% indicated it was 'too little'.

Q8. How challenging do you find your work?

92% of responses suggested that pupils were being appropriately challenged by their work with it being either a little challenging (35%), challenging (50%) or more challenging (7%). A further 8% said work was not challenging at all (4%) or too challenging (4%).

We also received a number of helpful comments as part of our survey. This information will be used by staff to ensure we identify strengths and next steps in our delivery of digital learning. Thank you again to everyone who participated in this survey.

Remote Learning Survey January 2021

Thank you to all of the children, parents and carers to participated in the Remote Learning survey which took place in January. This survey was accessible via the SeeSaw remote learning platform. If you do not have access to this, then please contact the school and we will support you in setting this up on your digital device.

Survey Results

Q1. When you are learning from home. Do you have all the resources you need. This includes pencils, paper and learning from your teacher.

93% of responses indicated that children had all (73%) or most (19%) of what they needed to complete remote learning. A further 7% said they had some of what they needed.

Q2. How easy do you find accessing the SeeSaw remote learning?

91% of responses indicated that children and families found the SeeSaw learning platform very easy (39%), easy (35%) or 'okay' (18%) to access. A further 9% indicated that it was difficult or very difficult.

Q3. What do you use at home to complete your remote online learning?

80% of responses indicated that children were using Chromebooks, laptops, iPads or tablets to access their remote learning. A further 20% suggested they were using a mobile phone to access remote learning.
