### WOW - The Year-Round Walk To School Challenge

As you will be aware, across the school, the classes have begun tracking journeys to and from school using the WOW! Travel Tracker. This is an interactive SMART Board tool which is completed by each child on a daily basis. Pupils record how they get to school on the **WOW Travel Tracker** and those who walk at least once per week for a month are rewarded with a themed badge.

We understand that often children attend Breakfast Club and so are driving to school on a daily basis, but travel home either on foot or use 'park and stride'. This should be the option they choose when logging their mode of transport on the Travel Tracker.

In order to monitor and alleviate some of the parking and travel issues around our school campus, it is important that as a school we gather as much evidence as possible from a range of sources to try to improve congestion and promote safe travel. This is carried out both by adults in school as well as by our P7 Junior Road Safety officers, Jessica and Azaria.

Thank you to everyone who came along to cheer on our children taking part in Sports Day. The weather was great and the children had a fantastic time competing!










# **Rights Respecting School Silver Award**
