



SEVERE WEATHER PLANS

Literacy and English

- Write five sentences using adjectives and a joining word to describe your morning. Think about capital letters, full stops, spelling and careful presentation. Ask your parent/ carer for feedback to help you improve.
- Choose a fiction text and read a short passage. Stop and predict what will happen next. Read on. Draw a picture and write an alternative ending to the text.
- Interview a member of your family. Consider 3 questions you would like to ask them about their opinion on severe weather.

Numeracy and Mathematics

- Visit <http://www.readwritecount.scot/count/> and choose some of the activities and games to complete with your family.
- Create a diary observing the weather outside. Draw a clock face for each observation, note the time and draw/ write a brief description of the weather outside. Consider measuring snow or rainfall with a ruler and recording this in your log!

RE

- Choose a Bible story and create a comic strip with 6 pictures to sequence the story you read. Add a sentence to each picture.

Expressive Arts

- Draw a winters day picture in the style of pointillism. Pointillism is when the picture is made up purely by dots. A famous painter who uses this style is Georges Seurat. Look him up on the internet and watch the following clip for inspiration <https://www.bbc.co.uk/education/clips/zg6dsg8>. You don't have to use a cotton bud, you can use pens or pencils as well.

Social Studies

- Look at the weather forecast online or on the TV. Create your own weather map with symbols. You could even record yourself presenting the weather.

Health and Wellbeing

- Caring and sharing are important skills. Create a picture of two children caring and sharing in a) the classroom, b) the playground, c) in the dinner hall and d) at their house. You might want to add speech bubbles as well as facial expressions to show how the children are being caring and sharing with one another.
- Consider 'Our Learning Powers' throughout all the tasks you complete. Discuss which powers you have used and why you used them.
