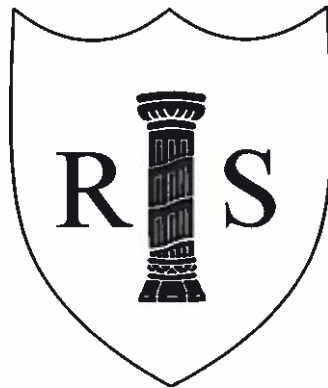

Visible Learning is the result of work done by John Hattie with the goal of finding out what provides the most success in learning. It is based on 15 years of research, covering more than 80 million pupils.

At Roslin, we are on a learning journey, taking into account all of this research!

➡ **Talk about what they are learning**

➡ **Explain their next steps**

➡ **Set learning goals**

➡ **See mistakes as opportunities for learning**

➡ **Know what to do when they're stuck**

    7. What will you do to improve your work?
    8. What will you do to improve your talent?
    9. What will you do to solve this problem?
  10. You had a setback, what will you do differently next time?

# What are we doing?

In December 2014, we asked every pupil, what makes a good learner?

The majority of answers were related to behaviour or 'someone who listens' or 'someone who works hard'. Since then, we have worked on developing their understanding of what makes a good learner. By teaching the children about the brain, growth and fixed mindsets and the opportunities that come from making mistakes, we have seen a huge improvement.

More children are recognising key learner qualities



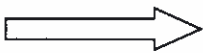
Less children are identifying good behaviour as the only key to being a good learner

We want to keep this good work going to ensure we reach ALL learners.

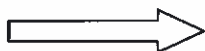
