## Literacy - Reading

**Read/listen to a story every day.**

You can read a book you have at home or if you have a library membership you can download the Borrowbox App and borrow a book electronically from the library. You can listen to some stories for free on Audible.

You can read on your own if you are able to or you can listen to someone reading to you.

Look at the grid below. You should complete at least three tasks, although you can of course do more if you wish.

Reading Challenge			
I read two stories from the same author. 	I wrote about my favourite author. 	I wrote a book review about one of my favourite author's books. 	I read a book by my friend's favourite author. 
I read books by three different authors. 	I found out more about my favourite author. 	I designed a word search about different authors. 	I read an interview or article about an author. 
I wrote a story in the style of my favourite author. 	I read a story by an author I hadn't heard of. 	I read a book by an author I thought I didn't like. 	I told my class about my favourite author. 

Obviously you can't do the one which asks you to tell your class about your favourite author but you could tell a family member instead.

Make sure that at least one of your chosen tasks is a written one. You can send it to me in Google Classroom.

## Literacy - Writing

**We are learning to write a senses poem.**


There are five human senses. Can you name them?

## Literacy - Talking and Listening

Think about a book have you have recently read or a story that someone has read to you.

Decide which part you liked best and draw a picture of it in your jotter.

Now show your picture to someone in your family and talk to them about the story.


Tell them what the story was about. Who wrote it and who illustrated it?

What did you like/dislike about it?

Explain what is happening in your picture and explain why you choose that part.



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Under each of the pictures make a list of how the senses make you think/describe Winter.

Finally, use your plan to write your own poem, copying the format in the example. You can use the first line if you want or if you prefer make up a new one.

A Winter picture below your poem would make it really attractive.

### Improve your addition skills - Dice Addition Game



This is a game for 1 or 2 players. You will need 2 dice and a sheet of paper.

You just roll the dice, write the numbers down then add them. If you're playing with someone take turns and make sure that you check each other's answers.

This is a good way to develop speed and accuracy.


Now try it with subtraction.

## Maths

I am learning to identify the properties of 2D shapes.



We have been learning about 2D shapes. We know that shapes can have sides and corners (where 2 or more sides meet)



### Weekly Lessons


You are able to join Madame Robertson live every Friday at 11am. (Sessions are recorded so you can catch it later at a time that suits. Each session last 15/20 minutes.)
