Primary 1 News

We are finishing a block of gymnastics where the classes have been mixed up, giving children the opportunity to work with friends from other classes.



Primary 2 News

P2 have been working very hard this term. We are focusing on subtraction this term as well as working with money.

In writing we have been concentrating on imaginative stories and have had fun creating characters, settings and writing about wonderful adventures.

Both classes have been learning all about People Who Help Us and in particular people who have roles within the emergency services. We have been organising visits from police, doctors and road safety officers. However, it would be great if anyone working within the other emergency services could give up some time to give an insight into their role, the children would really enjoy this.

P2A and P2B have both successfully presented their learning to the school in their separate school assemblies. The children had great fun learning lines, making props and showing everyone how much they have learned. Well Done Primary 2!



Primary 3 News

In P3 we have been exploring different landmarks in Edinburgh and have been comparing them to landmarks in Paris. We have also explored families in France and learnt how to describe our own families in French and made a family tree.



Primary 4 News

Primary 4A thoroughly enjoyed preparing a French picnic last week to mark the end of learning about France. We had crepes, croissants, pain au chocolat, baguette and French cheese. We are learning to talk about our likes and dislikes in French and have been working very hard on leaflets all about France, some of which you can see outside our classroom. As part of maths we have looked at different ways of recording numbers, including using Roman Numerals which we found challenging but enjoyed.

For the last part of the term we are learning about news articles, writing our own and also using drama skills to create a news story which we will film using the Ipads.

In Reading and Writing, P4B have looked at playscripts over the last few weeks and have now moved onto mystery and adventure stories. For Art we have all enjoyed printing and collage and are now looking at drawing before tackling painting (any old shirts or overalls you have, might be a good idea). We have also managed a number of Outdoor Learning sessions and hope to continue this, weather permitting!



Primary 5 News

Primary 5 have had a really busy few weeks. Our main focus has been the history of the local railways. We spent a lot of time researching this topic and creating timelines. We also looked at the local landscape in the past and we compared it with how it looks like today. We developed our mapping skills and looked at the social impact of the railways. We then worked together in teams to create an iMovie documentary to show our learning. You will be able to see our iMovie during our P5 Assembly on the 18th March. Primary 5 have also started skiing at Hillend. Everybody has approached learning this skill with a growth mindset by showing lots of determination and resilience. The instructors have been very impressed by the childrens' listening skills and enthusiasm.



Primary 6 News

Primary 6 children are continuing with their Space topic this term, and have already had an exciting day trip to the Glasgow Science Centre to explore the exhibits and then visit the Planetarium. They all had a fantastic day! The children have also been given the opportunity to explore Biking with the Midlothian Outdoor Education team, and have been learning how to use gears properly on mountain bikes. This month, both classes will be visiting Rosslyn Chapel, tying in with the Religious and Moral Education aspect of the curriculum. The P6 Euroquiz team competed against other schools from Midlothian on March 4th. Both teachers look forward to seeing as many parents/carers as possible at Parent's Consultations before the Easter break.



P7 News

P7 enjoyed a visit from The Royal Zoological Society of Scotland called 'Beyond the Panda'. We learned a great deal about panda's habitat, food and history. We were able to handle panda skulls, skin from different animals, play panda related games and even learned a little Mandarin. One part we all enjoyed was finding out about panda poo!
